

Privacy Policy

Ladwa Law Limited respects your privacy and is committed to protecting your personal data. This privacy policy will inform you as to how we look after your personal data when you visit our website (regardless of where you visit it from), and tell you about your privacy rights and how the law protects you.

The full version of our privacy policy is set out below.

Important information and who we are

Ladwa Law Limited is the controller and responsible for your personal data (collectively referred to as "**Ladwa Law**", "**we**", "**us**" or "**our**" in this privacy policy).

This privacy policy gives you information about how Ladwa Law collects and uses your personal data belonging to you or your personnel in the context of providing legal services to you or your business, through your use of our website and through any of the other ways we interact, as set out in more detail below.

The personal data we collect about you

Personal data means any information about an individual from which that person can be identified.

We may collect, use, store and transfer different kinds of personal data about you which we have grouped together as follows:

- "**Identity Data**" includes first name, middle names, last name, maiden or previous names, marital status, title, date of birth, gender, username or similar identifier, passport or driving licence number and photographic or video images of you.
- "**Contact Data**" includes billing address, postal address, email address and telephone numbers.
- "**Financial Data**" includes bank account and payment card details and includes details about payments to and from you and other details of services you have purchased from us.
- "**Professional Data**" includes job title, email address, telephone number, work addresses, previous positions, professional experience and qualifications.
- "**Technical Data**" includes internet protocol (IP) address, your login data, browser type and version, time zone setting and location, browser plug-in

types and versions, operating system and platform, device ID and other technology on the devices you use to access this website.

- **“Profile Data”** includes your username and password, purchases or orders made by you, your interests, preferences, feedback and survey responses.
- **“Usage Data”** includes information about how you interact with and use our website and services.
- **“Marketing and Communications Data”** includes your preferences in receiving marketing from us and our third parties and your communication preferences.

We also collect, use and share aggregated data such as statistical or demographic data which is not personal data as it does not directly (or indirectly) reveal your identity. For example, we may aggregate individuals' Usage Data to calculate the percentage of users accessing a specific website feature in order to analyse general trends in how users are interacting with our website to help improve the website and our service offering.

In certain circumstances, our collection of the different categories of data set out above may include the collection of **“Special Categories of Personal Data”** about you (this includes details about your race or ethnicity, religious or philosophical beliefs, sex life, sexual orientation, political opinions, trade union membership, information about your health, and genetic and biometric data). In limited circumstances, we also may collect information about your criminal convictions and previous criminal offences.

If you fail to provide personal data

Where we need to collect personal data by law, or under the terms of our engagement with you (as set out in our engagement letter and terms of business), and you fail to provide that data when requested, we may not be able to perform the services set out in the engagement letter.

How is your personal data collected?

We use different methods to collect data from and about you including:

- In the process of carrying out work for you (or your business) where we will in almost all instances act as a controller. In very limited circumstances we may act as a processor in which case we will let you know and ensure that an appropriate contract is put in place.
- When we communicate with you by email or other electronic correspondence, by telephone or using video conferencing software. You may give us your Identity, Contact and Financial Data by filling in forms or

by corresponding or communicating with us by post, phone, email or otherwise. This includes personal data you provide when you:

- make a request for our services;
 - subscribe to our publications;
 - request marketing to be sent to you; or
 - provide us with feedback.
- Networking (for example, at in-person or virtual events).
 - Otherwise through providing our legal services and operating our business.

We also collect data from and about you via our website:

- Through your actions (for example, when you submit an enquiry form).
- Through automated technologies or interactions. As you interact with our website, we may automatically collect Technical Data about your equipment, browsing actions and patterns. We collect this personal data by using cookies, server logs and other similar technologies. Please see our Cookie Policy for further details.
- Through third parties or publicly available sources. We may receive Identity Data, Contact Data, Financial Data, Technical Data and Special Categories of Personal Data about you from various third parties and public sources in the following circumstances:
 - when we carry out our anti-money laundering or other background checks;
 - if we are required to deal with or engage with any governmental or regulatory bodies either in relation to you or on your behalf;
 - if we collect data from analytics or search information providers such as Google, providers of technical, payment and delivery services or data brokers or aggregators; or
 - if we collect data from publicly available sources which may include public registers such as Companies House, the Electoral Register, the Solicitors Regulation Authority, the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales, HM Treasury and the Land Registry.

How we use your personal data

The law requires us to have a legal basis for collecting and using your personal data. We rely on one or more of the following legal bases:

- **Performance of a contract.** Where we need to perform the contract we are about to enter into or have entered into with you.
- **Legitimate interests.** Where it is necessary for our legitimate interests as a legal services provider (or those of a third party) and your interests and fundamental rights do not override those interests.
- **Legal or regulatory obligation.** Where we need to comply with a legal or regulatory obligation to which we are subject.
- **Prevention of money laundering or terrorist financing.**
- **Consent.** We rely on consent only where (a) we have obtained your active agreement to use your personal data for a specified purpose, for example if you subscribe to an email newsletter; or (b) processing of "special category data" is necessary in the context of legal claims or where another legal ground other than explicit consent is available to us under relevant data protection legislation; or (c) our legal services require us to process "special category data" and where we have obtained your explicit consent to do so. If we seek and obtain your consent, you may withdraw it at any time.

Purposes for which we will use your personal data

We have set out below, in a table format, a description of all the ways we plan to use your personal data, and which of the legal bases we rely on to do so. We have also identified what our legitimate interests are where appropriate.

Direct marketing

We strive to provide you with choices regarding certain personal data uses, particularly around marketing and advertising. You will receive marketing communications from us if you have requested information from us or purchased goods or services from us and you have not opted out of receiving that marketing.

Third-party marketing

We will get your express opt-in consent before we share your personal data with any third party for marketing purposes.

Opting out of marketing

You can ask us or third parties to stop sending you marketing messages at any time by following the opt-out links on any marketing message sent to you or by contacting us.

Disclosures of your personal data

We may share your personal data with the parties set out below for the purposes set out in the table above.

- Third parties such as (a) professional advisers including solicitors, financial institutions, accountants, auditors and other service providers who provide

legal, financial, accounting, insurance, IT and system administration services to us.

- Third parties to whom we may choose to sell, transfer or merge parts of our business or our assets. Alternatively, we may seek to acquire other businesses or merge with them. If a change happens to our business, then the new owners may use your personal data in the same way as set out in this privacy policy.
- Third parties to whom we are obliged or requested to make such disclosure by any court, governmental, regulatory or other authority.

We require all third parties to respect the security of your personal data and to treat it in accordance with the law. We do not allow our third-party service providers to use your personal data for their own purposes and only permit them to process your personal data for specified purposes and in accordance with our instructions.

International transfers

We do not transfer your personal data outside the UK.

Data security

We have put in place appropriate security measures to prevent your personal data from being accidentally lost, used or accessed in an unauthorised way, altered or disclosed. In addition, we limit access to your personal data to those employees, agents, contractors and other third parties who have a business need to know. They will only process your personal data on our instructions and they are subject to a duty of confidentiality.

Data retention - how long will you use my personal data for?

We will only retain your personal data for as long as reasonably necessary to fulfil the purposes we collected it for or where we have an ongoing legitimate business need to do so, including for the purposes of satisfying any legal, regulatory, tax, accounting or reporting requirements. We may retain your personal data for a longer period in the event of a complaint or if we reasonably believe there is a prospect of litigation in respect to our relationship with you.

To determine the appropriate retention period for personal data, we consider the amount, nature and sensitivity of the personal data, the potential risk of harm from unauthorised use or disclosure of your personal data, the purposes for which we process your personal data and whether we can achieve those purposes through other means, and the applicable legal, regulatory, tax, accounting or other requirements.

In some circumstances we will anonymise your personal data (so that it can no longer be associated with you) for research or statistical purposes, in which case we may use this information indefinitely without further notice to you.

Your legal rights

You have rights under data protection laws in relation to your personal data to:

- Request access to your personal data (commonly known as a "subject access request"). This enables you to receive a copy of the personal data we hold about you and to check that we are lawfully processing it.
- Request correction of the personal data that we hold about you. This enables you to have any incomplete or inaccurate data we hold about you corrected, though we may need to verify the accuracy of the new data you provide to us.
- Request erasure of your personal data in certain circumstances. This enables you to ask us to delete or remove personal data where there is no good reason for us continuing to process it. You also have the right to ask us to delete or remove your personal data where you have successfully exercised your right to object to processing (see below), where we may have processed your information unlawfully or where we are required to erase your personal data to comply with local law. Note, however, that we may not always be able to comply with your request of erasure for specific legal reasons which will be notified to you, if applicable, at the time of your request.
- Object to processing of your personal data where we are relying on a legitimate interest (or those of a third party) as the legal basis for that particular use of your data (including carrying out profiling based on our legitimate interests). In some cases, we may demonstrate that we have compelling legitimate grounds to process your information which override your right to object.
- You also have the absolute right to object any time to the processing of your personal data for direct marketing purposes (see the section above titled **Opting out of marketing**).
- Request the transfer of your personal data to you or to a third party. We will provide to you, or a third party you have chosen, your personal data in a structured, commonly used, machine-readable format. Note that this right only applies to automated information which you initially provided consent for us to use or where we used the information to perform a contract with you.

- Withdraw consent at any time where we are relying on consent to process your personal data. However, this will not affect the lawfulness of any processing carried out before you withdraw your consent. If you withdraw your consent, we may not be able to provide certain services to you. We will advise you if this is the case at the time you withdraw your consent.
- Request restriction of processing of your personal data. This enables you to ask us to suspend the processing of your personal data in one of the following scenarios:
 - If you want us to establish the data's accuracy;
 - Where our use of the data is unlawful but you do not want us to erase it;
 - Where you need us to hold the data even if we no longer require it as you need it to establish, exercise or defend legal claims; or
 - You have objected to our use of your data but we need to verify whether we have overriding legitimate grounds to use it.

If you wish to exercise any of the rights set out above, please contact us using the details set out below.

No fee usually required

You will not have to pay a fee to access your personal data (or to exercise any of the other rights). However, we may charge a reasonable fee if your request is clearly unfounded, repetitive or excessive. Alternatively, we could refuse to comply with your request in these circumstances.

What we may need from you

We may need to request specific information from you to help us confirm your identity and ensure your right to access your personal data (or to exercise any of your other rights). This is a security measure to ensure that personal data is not disclosed to any person who has no right to receive it. We may also contact you to ask you for further information in relation to your request to speed up our response.

Time limit to respond

We try to respond to all legitimate requests within one month. Occasionally it could take us longer than a month if your request is particularly complex or you have made a number of requests. In this case, we will notify you and keep you updated.
